Rebecca Lukens Award Presentation

It was a festive group that gathered on March 22 to be part of the presentation of the Sixth Annual Rebecca Lukens Award to **Tammy Cansler** for her years of work in the area of affordable housing in Coatesville. After Graystone Society President Scott Huston's introduction, Rebecca Lukens story was related by Susannah Brody (in character as Rebecca.)

Mrs. Cansler founded the Cansler Investment Group, a real estate development company dedicated to bringing safe and affordable housing to the people of Coatesville in 1985. She was instrumental in the creation of the North Second Avenue Redevelopment Project, Penns Crossing Townhomes, and most recently the Brandywine Center on Lincoln Highway.


